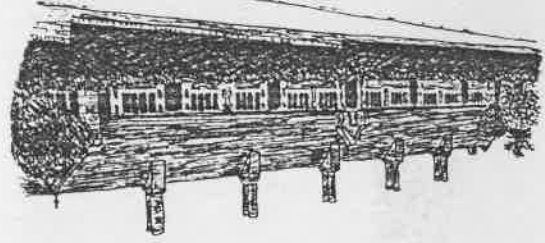
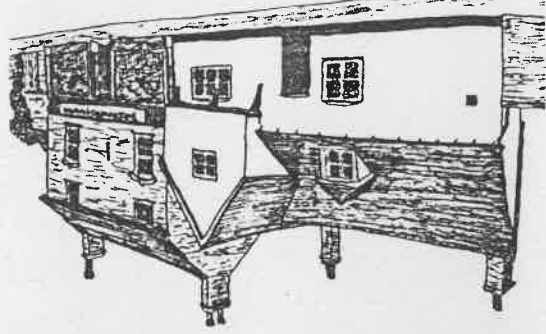


A new road named Summer Road was built at the side of the Town Hall linking High Street with what was previously known as Back Lane. This road followed an original footpath link known as The Croft.



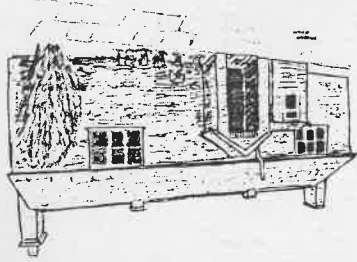
They were named the Colehaven homes.

16. This cottage is a good example of a sixteenth century jettied building.



Bressumer beams support the upper storey, at the moment they are covered in stucco. Adjoining this cottage is an 18th century house with rounded-top windows.

is recorded, 'About twenty girls, under the age of fourteen, are taught to read and sew and do plain work, and regularly attend divine service in the church.' The school



was behind the house through a passageway.

It consisted of two adjoining single storey rooms with typically high windows of that period - the children could not be distracted! It is now used as the Parish Room for many events including a weekly W.I. market. The schoolroom was superseded in 1890 by an extension to the 'Back Lane School'.

15. Colehill Town Hall was built in 1926 by public donation. This in effect replaced the Market Hall as the principle meeting place. It served then as the new Magistrates court.
