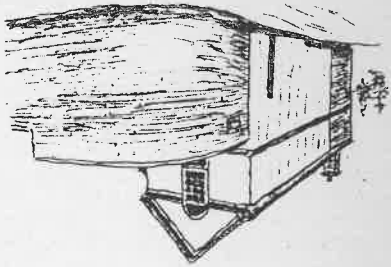

24. Roman Catholic Chapel.



This was probably an old stable and coaching block to Nantile House on Coleshill High Street. The chapel was above it. Until the new church was built in 1880 on the Coventry Road, priests served this chapel from Erdington. It then reverted back to a stable block; it is now a private residence.

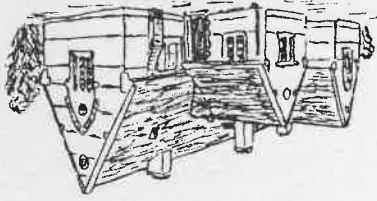
25. This is the former Back Lane entrance to the Angel Inn. This attractive mews development includes



some of the stabling of the inn. It is necessary to view the inn from the High Street. On your left you will see Parkfield Court.

21. The Red Lion Inn - a former coaching inn serving the south side of Coleshill on the very important road to Holyhead and to Worcester. This is in a row of a variety of Victorian houses.

22. Parkfield Road School often known as the 'Back Lane School' was built in 1872 for boys and infants with the help of



the Digby family - the Lord of the Manor.

A schoolmasters house was built by it. The school was moved to other premises in 1982 and this building became the Civic Centre.

Parkfield Road or Back Lane was the back access to many of the buildings on the High Street, which were built on

medieval buruage plots. In the 18th and 19th centuries many of these plots on 'Back Lane' were in-filled with a variety of dwellings, many of which can still be seen today. The Memorial Park was given to the town for recreation.
