Notice of 24-hour single lane closure and road closure on the A446 southbound

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Early works for HS2 are carried out by a joint venture between Laing O'Rourke and Murphy & Sons known as LM. In your area, we are working near the A452, A45 and M42, which surround the site of the future HS2 Interchange Station.

We're improving the local road network

During 2020, we are building four new highways bridges in the area that surrounds the future HS2 Interchange Station. In the future, these bridges will connect the current road network to new routes we are creating. The first of these new highways bridges was safely installed in August over the M42. After we install the second of these bridges over the A446 from Friday 23 October to Monday 26 October, we will carry out various activities to reinstate the road. To conduct these safely, we will install a 24-hour single lane closure and then a road closure.

We'll be starting work on Monday 26 October

To carry out this work, we'll first install a temporary 24-hour single lane closure along the A446 southbound from Monday 26 October for approximately five days (see map on next page). If we install the second bridge over the A446 faster than expected, and therefore reopen the A452 and A446 before Monday 26 October, we will install the 24-hour single lane closure from that point. To complete our activities to reinstate the road, when we remove the 24-hour single lane closure, we will install a temporary road closure along the A446 southbound from Friday 30 October for one night (see map on next page).

HS2 during the coronavirus pandemic

We are continually reviewing the works on our construction sites in line with Government and Public Health England (PHE) advice on dealing with coronavirus. The Government's current strategy makes clear that construction activity can continue if it complies with this guidance.

The health and safety of our workforce and the communities we affect is our key priority. Please be assured that those sites that are currently still working are doing so because they can operate within PHE and construction industry guidelines.

Duration of works

From Monday 26 October for one week in total.

Working hours will be 24-hours.

What to expect

We will temporarily install a 24-hour single lane closure on the A446 southbound.

You will still be able to travel along the A446 in both directions during the single lane closure.

We will then temporarily install one overnight road closure on the A446 southbound.

What we will do

Keep all sites safe and secure.

Leave the area in a tidy state when works are complete.

Maintain building access.

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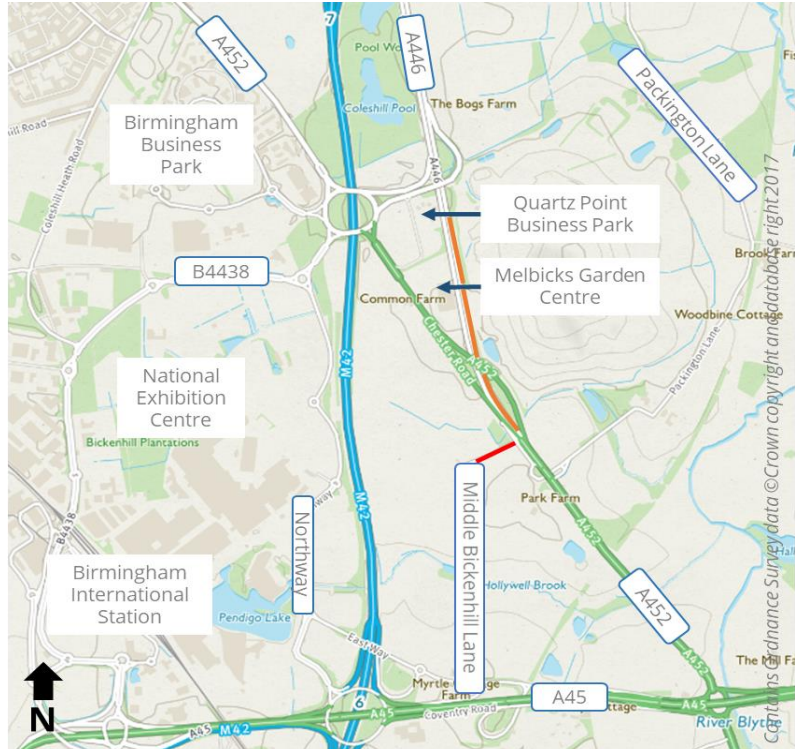
Location of 24-hour single lane closure on the A446 southbound

If we install the second bridge over the A446 faster than expected, and therefore reopen the A452 and A446 before Monday 26 October, we will install the 24-hour single lane closure on the A446 southbound from that point.



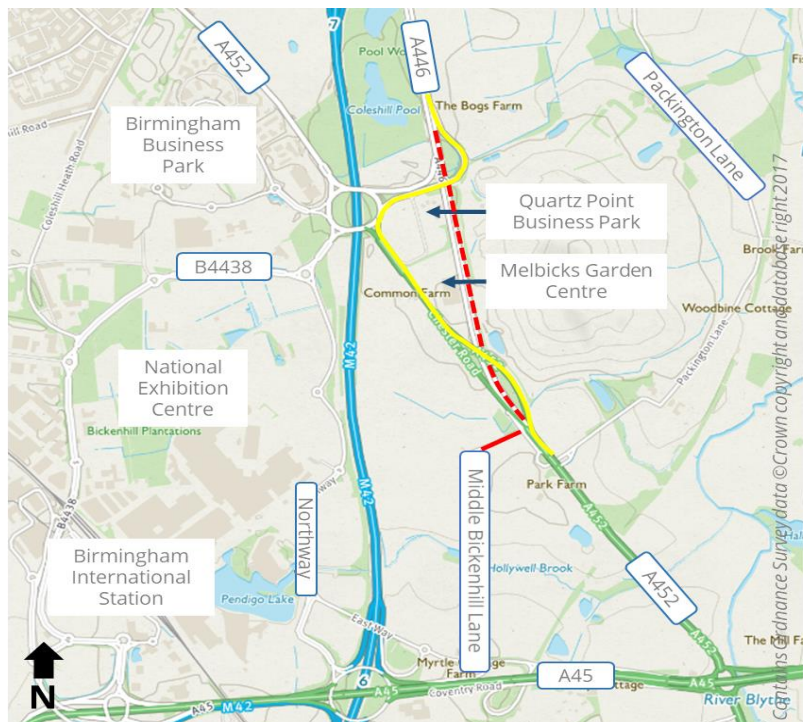
Location of road closure on the A446 southbound
