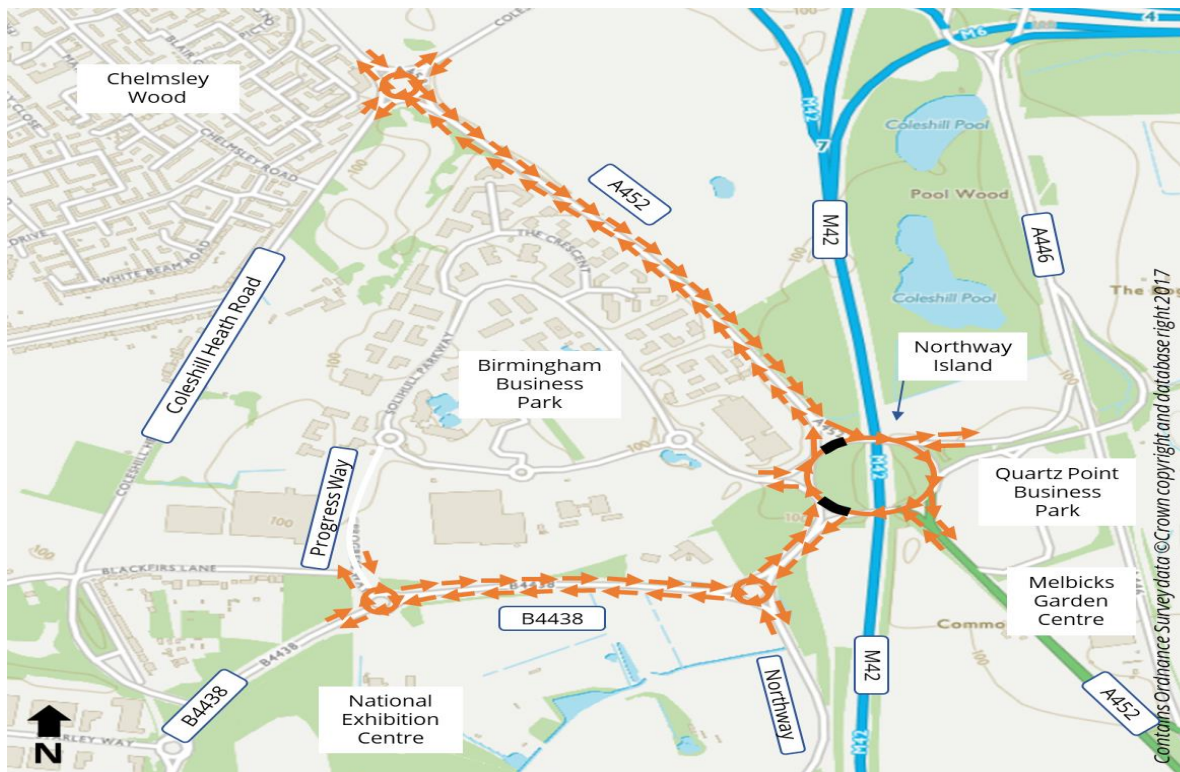


Traffic rerouting around Northway Island from 26 April for four weeks

From 5am on Monday 26 April for four weeks, short sections of Northway Island will be closed. As a result, road users will no longer be able to travel around the whole of the Island and you may be redirected from and back to the Island.

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.



Traffic rerouting will begin on Monday 26 April

From **5am on Monday 26 April for four weeks**, short sections of Northway Island will be closed. As a result, road users will no longer be able to travel around the whole of the Island. Depending on your direction of travel, you may be redirected from Northway Island and back to access routes either side of the M42. **You will still be able to access all routes, there will just be a short diversion from some parts of Northway Island.**

The map above outlines the new direction of travel for road users from 5am on Monday 26 April for four weeks, around Northway Island, and the location of closed sections of the Island. **Direction of travel along the B4438, A452 and Northway will be unaffected, and you will still be able to access all routes in the area.**

Map key

- = new direction of travel for the next four weeks
- = closed sections of Northway Island during the next four weeks

- Maintain access to all buildings, businesses and travel routes in the area
- Install directional signage for road users
